Directions: Deer Hollow Farm is located in Rancho San Antonio County Park in the foothills above Los Altos. Take Highway 280 to Foothill Expressway. Go south and turn right on Cristo Rey Drive. Proceed about a mile and turn left into the Park. The Ohlone Village is a level 1-mile walk on pavement or trails from the parking lot. Parking is limited so give yourself lots of time and carpool if possible.
